

**BRITISH OPEN BY SEA 2007
ONBOARD THE M/S CLIPPER ADVENTURER
JULY 14 – JULY 23, 2007**

Saturday, July 14

This evening depart the United States.

Sunday, July 15

Arrive Glasgow Airport to be met by PerryGolf personnel. Transfer on arrival to our early baggage check in and lounge facility in Glasgow City. This facility will be available for the convenience of all passengers, particularly those who are arriving early and will be in operation throughout the day.



You will be free to explore the cultural city of Glasgow at leisure before transferring to the M/S Clipper Adventurer at Greenock (40mins journey) for embarkation at 4:00pm.

Your welcome aboard briefing will take place this evening prior to dinner.

This evening the M/S Clipper Adventurer will depart Greenock and sail to her next berth in Troon.



Monday, July 16

Golfers today play at **Prestwick Golf Club** (www.prestwickgc.co.uk). Founded in 1851, Prestwick is steeped in golfing history. The first Open Championship was played here in 1860, over a 12-hole course. Seven of the original greens are still played to today. The course is a very testing layout, with tight fairways guarded by gorse and deep bunkering around the greens demanding accuracy from tee to green and patience to make your score. Many blind shots will give the player a taste of traditional Scottish links golf at its best.



Non Golfers will have the opportunity to visit the **Isle of Arran**. (Full Day Tour) Arran is the one of the most southerly islands in Scotland. A total of 56 miles in circumference the island is often referred to as Scotland in Miniature. Within a short compass it captures many aspects of the beauty of Scotland as a whole, from towering granite peaks to peaceful sandy bays overlooked by palm trees growing in the warm

climate of The Gulf Stream. There are colonies of seals near coastal caves, trails and pathways to mysterious Bronze Age Stone Circles. The ferry crossing will arrive in Brodick, the largest village on the island where a visit to **Brodick Castle** is planned. Continuing on the north circular route the journey will pass through many interesting picturesque villages and pass down the western shores with contrasting views to the Kintyre peninsula before returning across the “String Road” with its mountainous views to Brodick.



This evening the M/S Clipper Adventurer will depart Troon and around the Mull of Kintyre towards our next port of call at Greencastle, Ireland.

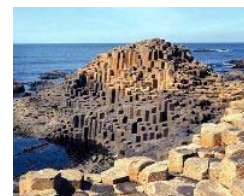
Tuesday, July 17

Golfers today play at Ballyliffin - Glashedy Links

(www.ballyliffingolfclub.com) The courses at Ballyliffin can be found on the scenic Inishowen Peninsula and are the most northerly located in Ireland. The Glashedy Course is a magnificent modern links set on the most natural of dunes land. The course was designed by the notable Irish Architects Pat Ruddy and Tom Craddock and opened for play in 1995. There are many changes in elevation as the course winds its way through the dunes offering stunning views over the Atlantic Ocean as the waves crash against Glashedy Rock. A very testing course that can still be enjoyed by all standards of golfers due to the strategic placement of tees.



Non Golfers shore excursion will travel to the North Antrim Coast. We head through the town of Portrush to our first stop at Dunluce Castle. The jagged silhouette of the ruins of **Dunluce Castle** rises from the cliff edge above the sea. Enjoy spectacular views of the Antrim Coastline as we head to our next stop at **Bushmills Distillery**, the oldest licensed whiskey distillery in the world, established in 1608. Enjoy a guided tour and tasting before lunch. Following lunch we pay a visit to the lunar landscape of the **Giant's Causeway**. Legend has it that the causeway is the work of the giant Finn McCool, the Ulster warrior and



commander of the king of Ireland's armies. The causeway proper is the most spectacular series of geological features to be found along the North Antrim Coast consisting of 40,000 columns rising from the sea.

This evening the M/S Clipper Adventurer will depart Greencastle and begin her sail around the western and northern shores of Scotland.

Wednesday, July 18



The M/S Clipper Adventurer will continue its journey through the Western Isles travelling along the shores of the Isle of Skye before arriving in Loch Ewe by late morning. A visit to **Inverewe Gardens** is planned before lunch. Disembarking by zodiac landing craft we will arrive directly into the gardens, which are managed by the National Trust of Scotland. The warm currents of the North Atlantic Drift help to create an oasis of colour and fertility where exotic plants from many countries give an almost continual display of colour throughout the year.

Following lunch onboard we continue along the western shores until turning east around **Cape Wrath**, the most north-westerly tip of the British Isles. As night falls we pass John O'Groats, then head south along the north-eastern shores of Scotland towards our next berth at Invergordon in the Cromarty Firth.

Thursday, July 19

Golfers today play at Royal Dornoch Golf Club

(www.royaldornoch.com) Located on the shores of the Dornoch Firth you will have the opportunity to play the most northerly of the Championship courses of the British Isles. Dornoch is perhaps more than most, a thinking golfers' course where it is not enough simply to keep the ball on the fairway. The greens are generally open in the front, but they are also set on plateaux several feet above the fairway. It requires a well struck shot to hold the green and if not, a difficult recovery shot.





Non golfers will depart Invergordon and travel north for a visit to **Glenmorangie Distillery**, overlooking the shores of the Dornoch Firth. The name Glenmorangie comes from the Gaelic language and means “Glen of Tranquillity”. A personal guided tour will introduce you to the natural elements and the time honoured traditional skills in the whisky making process. Continue to the



town of Dornoch. A wonderful Highland town, clustered around its little Cathedral all in local stone. There are several charming antique shops and gift stores to be found in the town. Our tour will conclude with a scenic drive to the **Falls of Shin**. These waterfalls are located in a picturesque wood in the Achany Glen. This is an ideal spot to watch the salmon migrate upstream.

This evening the M/S Clipper Adventurer will depart Invergordon and sail to her next berth in Aberdeen.

Friday, July 20

Golfers today play at **Royal Aberdeen Golf Club**

(www.royalaberdeengolf.com) The sixth oldest club in the world. The links at Balgownie are located on the northeastern shores of Aberdeen, overlooking the North Sea. The course is a fine Scottish Links with a traditional out and back layout. The front nine stretches between the sand dunes and the North Sea and returns inland on flatter terrain with gorse lined tight fairways. It is a demanding course that will test the skills of all players.



Non Golfers will enjoy a tour of the Granite City of Aberdeen. Solid and confident, Aberdeen's foundations are in its University and its Port. The city presents a modern cosmopolitan image and many visitors are often surprised by the many diverse attractions, which this regional capital offers. Following our tour of the city and lunch onboard the Adventurer an afternoon visit to **Crathes Castle and Gardens** is planned. The tower house with its many turrets and gables provides a fairy tale quality, which would have made for a lavish family home. Look out for some remarkable original painted ceilings. Be sure to visit the award winning gardens, which were established in their present form in the nineteenth century.

This evening the M/S Clipper Adventurer will depart Aberdeen and sail to her next berth in Dundee.

Saturday, July 21

Golfers today play at **Kingsbarns Golf Links**

(www.kingsbarns.com). The course officially opened in 2000 and has quickly been established as one of the finest links courses in Scotland. A challenging links experience awaits golfers as the course's spacious fairways roll and twist over dune ridges and hollows through Scottish heather and wispy rough along 1.5 miles of scenic coastline near St. Andrews. The main challenge is the vast and heavily contoured greens that require clever shotmaking on your approach other you are looking at a three putt or worse.





Non golfers will enjoy a visit to St. Andrews, one of the most Historic Towns of Scotland. Hallowed in the hearts of golfers the world over, **St. Andrews** is also a centre of Secular, Spiritual and Academic life. A walking tour is planned around this University town. Take a stroll through the **Cathedral** grounds, once the resting place of Scotland's patron saint and after whom the town is named, and pass the castle where the Bishops lived when St Andrews was the Ecclesiastical capital of the country. The town is the perfect place to gift shop with hundreds of stores and boutiques, each with its own character and

charm. The opportunity will exist to spend more time in St. Andrews or tour the coastline of the East Neuk of Fife, visiting the quaint fishing villages with their distinctive buildings and picturesque harbours.

The M/S Clipper Adventurer will remain overnight at her berth in Dundee.

Sunday, July 22

Today all passengers will have the opportunity to attend the **Final Round of the British Open Championship at Carnoustie**. The course is located on the south side of Carnoustie, between the railway and the shore of the river Tay estuary, 12 miles to the east of Dundee. Renowned as the toughest of the courses used for The Open, expatriate Scot Tommy Armour was the winner when the Championship was first played here in 1931. He



has been followed by a succession of famous champions - Henry Cotton, Ben Hogan, Gary Player, Tom

Watson, and finally by fellow Scot Paul Lawrie in 1999 when Carnoustie rejoined the rota of Open courses after a gap of 24 years.



This evening the M/S Clipper Adventurer will depart Dundee and sail to her final berth in Leith (Edinburgh).

Monday, July 23

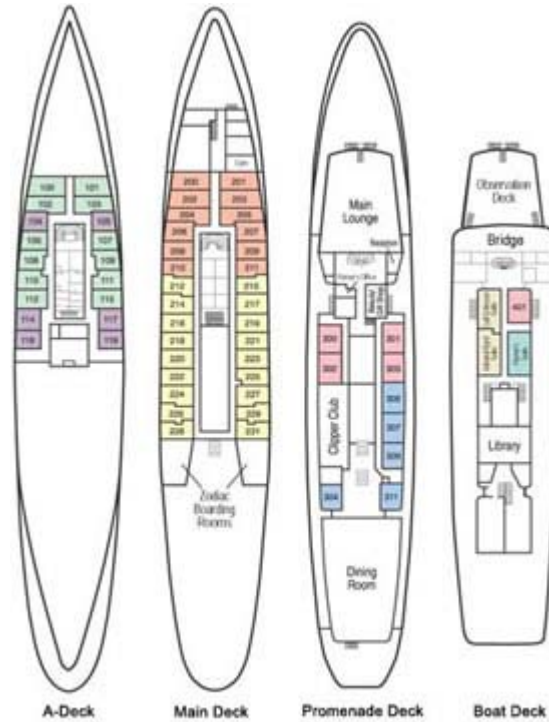
