Today play the outstanding **Cruden Bay (tbc)**, which provides panoramic views of the North Sea from various points on the course. The greens are hidden between large sand dunes, and blind shots are featured prominently on this challenging links. This remarkable course is consistently ranked in the Top 100 in the World.

Play **Royal Aberdeen (tbc)**, the sixth oldest club in the world. This is a demanding test of Scottish links golf which runs along the North Sea Shore. The inward nine runs through yellow whins and purple heather and provides a unique contrast to the sand dunes which are dominant in the outward holes. Host venue for the Scottish Open in 2014.

Tuesday, June 4

Today play the **Trump International Golf Links (tbc)** Designed by Dr Martin Hawtree and opened in July 2012. The course follows a classic pattern of two out and back loops of nine holes. All 18 holes threading their way through the dunes, rising to find views of the sea and coastline and plunging into secluded valleys.

Wednesday, June 5

Today play **Carnoustie (tbc)**. With its thick rough and devilish bunkers, Carnoustie is known as one of the world's most challenging links courses and considered by many to be the most challenging of all Open venues. While the links is relatively flat it is exposed to the elements, a combination of length and accuracy are required from the tee to avoid the clever placement of the fairway bunkers and approach shots demand precision to greens heavily guarded by steep bunkers and burns. Arguably the toughest and most memorable finishing holes in championship golf. A state of the art clubhouse facility was completed in time for the 2018 Open Championship, containing seven Foresight simulators and the excellent Rookery Restaurant with panoramic views of the golf courses and the sea.

Thursday, June 6

Golf today on **Muirfield (tbc)**, home of the Honourable Company of Edinburgh Golfers, and consistently ranked as Scotland's finest course. The course of today was laid out by Harry Colt. The clockwise front nine envelopes the anti-clockwise back nine creating the ultimate layout which causes you to play in a variety of wind directions. The Open Championship was held at Muirfield for the 16th time in 2013 when Phil Mickelson claimed the Claret Jug . Please note strict handicap limits are set by the club. Men & Ladies 18.

Play today at **North Berwick (tbc)**. Like St.Andrews the links starts and finishes in the town. One of Scotland's earliest golf clubs and correspondingly a very traditional links layout. The West Course requires unusual shotmaking, along with blind shots and play over stone dykes. Features the par 3, 15th 'Redan' which is probably the most frequently copied short hole in the world. Entered into the Top 100 Courses in the World in the 2007 Rankings.
